Our aim is to host these sessions around the UK to enable as many CPs to attend as practically possible. 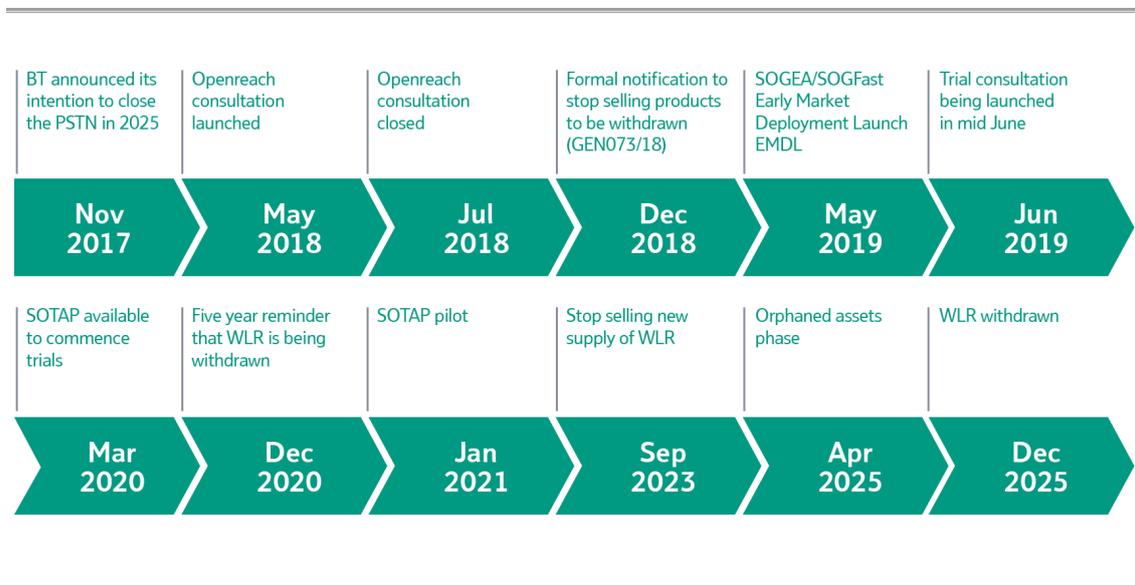
Our next industry working group meeting is on 20 June 2019 at Riverside House in London. The key topics being discussed at this session include:

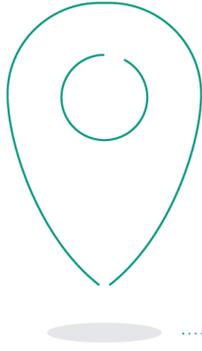

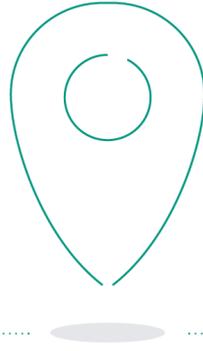

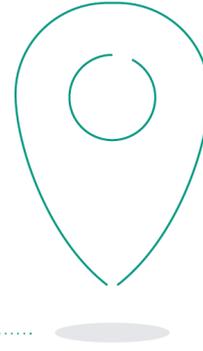

WLR Withdrawal – The product team's view

It's been 12 months since we launched the consultation on closing WLR, and what a lot has happened in that time!

Our industry working group sessions are now well established and are running bimonthly and are supported by more focussed sessions that enable us to get into the finer detail. We encourage all our CPs and industry groups to get involved.

These sessions provide the opportunity for Openreach to update our CPs and industry groups with the latest information, whilst providing an environment for us to work together to design new industry processes. A great example of this is our current work on designing a new process that will be used to manage migrations as we move closer to the withdrawal deadline and more forced action may be required. Raising awareness with Critical National Infrastructure (CNI) organisations has also been a key priority. There are some important

companies who use WLR products to operate their businesses and help keep the UK running, in sectors such as Chemicals, Civil Nuclear, Communications, Defence, Emergency Services, Energy, Finance, Food, Government, Health, Space, Transport and Water.

It's now more important than ever that we understand your customer base and what their lines are being used for. This will help us work collaboratively to plan your asset transfers; planning and identifying the order journeys and appropriate service wraps for each of your market segments will help minimise any end customer impacts.

Other topics currently being discussed at our working group sessions are:

- CP communication material - We've updated the Openreach website and added a section to include new CP communication material which includes a short animated video to support CPs in understanding what's happening and the timescales.
- CP and CP resellers engagement
- Building a CP inventory of lines
- WLR stop sell order journeys
- WLR withdrawal and FTTP uplift trial – There will be a consultation with industry on the proposed trials in June 2019.

Over the next three months we'll be working with you through the industry trial consultation process, whilst focussing on developing the next steps for managing orphaned end customers, to ensure no one is left disconnected. We'll also update you on the testing facility requirements for special services such as alarm lines, health pendants etc. as they evolve.

Update from the business development team

This is a very exciting time to work in Openreach with so much happening in the IP world. I'm excited about our customer's plans to take advantage of the changing dynamics in our industry. Here are some common questions we've received:

Is FTTP exchange uplift linked to WLR3 Withdrawal? Yes, however, they are two separate programmes but they have synergies which link them together. We're proposing to trial the stop sell of the WLR and related products in advance of the national stop sell date notified for September 2023. There will be a consultation with industry covering both trials which will be published in June 2019.

Do you host knowledge calls discussing the all IP Programme (WLR3 closure)? Yes we're planning to run a series of knowledge calls to reach out to as many CPs as possible, making sure no one is left behind. The next call is on 27 June 2019 at 2pm. The objective of the call is to summarise the programme and latest feedback from industry and working groups. This is an opportunity for those of you that haven't been involved in the working groups to get yourself up to speed with the latest information. Update on the Single Order Transitional Access Product (SOTAP) development

The SOTAP development is well underway and Openreach plans to commence the first trial of SOTAP in March 2020, using test lines in a controlled environment.

CPs consuming SOTAP would either need a Point of Presence in the telephone exchange based on LLU infrastructure or they would need to consume the product via a wholesaler who is offering SOTAP in that area.

Following a second trial with a limited volume of real lines (scheduled for September 2020) Openreach plans to Pilot the product at a geographical location in January 2021. Exciting GEA-FTTP announcements

- We've achieved our target of passing 1.2 million premises by March 2019
- We've also recently announced that we'll be increasing our overall target of three to four million premises by March 2021. Our target of 10 million premises by the mid-2020s has also increased to 15 million and remains subject to conditions being right
- With the recent addition of Salisbury as our first Fibre Exchange Upgrade location, we're now covering 26 fibre towns and cities in Great Britain and a further 11 locations in Northern Ireland
- We're providing GEA-FTTP to both green field new sites and brown field sites
- Since 1 April 2019 we've expanded our GEA-FTTP on Demand product to take 100 orders per month, increasing our capacity five-fold. This product helps customers to order fibre in other areas that are not covered by our Fibre Cities or Green Field New Site build plans
- Trial pricing announced on 1 February 2019 for specific exchange areas ([NGA2001/19](#)). Full details can be found in the [special offer section of the price list](#)

SOGEA and SOGfast latest news

- The core SOGEA and SOGfast developments are complete and CPs are actively piloting the products.
- Both products are being piloted in Northern Ireland, North East, East and South East England. We recently expanded our geographic coverage to include London and the whole of Northern England.
- Full national operational expansion is planned within the final phase of the pilot, prior to early market deployment subject to achieving pilot volume and quality criteria. Further CP engagement in the pilot phase is welcome. Please contact your business development manager to learn how you can get involved in the transformation to all IP
